What does the CIP Host Family provide?

- A private sleeping room for the participant to relax and study.
- Breakfast and Dinner on most days, with the possibility of participant packing a bag lunch.
- Orientation to your household, including explanations for items such as showers, appliances, and any alarm systems. This can include any chores that are expected.
- Tender Love and Care CIP
 Participants may be adults, but they too will appreciate your interest in their families and native countries.
- Participants may require assistance with planning transportation options. They will have WVU ID cards that allow access to PRT and the Mountain Line.
- Invitations to participate in regular family experiences and outings. Host Families may request a \$50 stipend to pay for activities.
- Conversation and Socialization -WVCIP Participants learn so much from their families!!
